Attendance Policy

The career development curriculum within the MD/PhD Program consists of MD/PhD seminars and symposia. Students are expected to attend at least 70% of the MD/PhD student-led seminars, and fully participate in the MD/PhD Bi-Annual Retreat (as scheduled), the CIP Annual General Meeting (November 19, 2019, in Toronto) and the annual MD Program Medical Student Research Day (MSRD) (early February) during the pre-clinical (Foundations) phase of the MD Program and during full-time PhD studies. Lack of engagement in these career development activities will be reviewed with the Director, MD/PhD Program.

Optional Post-Seminar Dinner

MD/PhD student seminars will be followed by an optional dinner for MD/PhD students at a reasonably priced restaurant (no more than approx. \$20 per person, inclusive of tax and gratuity). The dinner is traditionally paid for by that day's presenter and reimbursed by the MD/PhD Office. It is recommended that the presenter discusses his/her restaurant choice with or obtains a list of suggested restaurants from the Program Manager, PST, to avoid any reimbursement issues. Originals of the itemized receipt and the credit card receipt must be included with your completed and signed expense reimbursement form, including a note on the number of persons who attended the dinner.

Important notes:

Alcohol will not be reimbursed.

All in attendance at a post-seminar dinner must do their best to ensure that the dinner events remain a sustainable privilege for current and future MD/PhD students.
